Statement Regarding Activities Involving the Fate of East Turkistan

To the attention of our fellow East Turkistani people and all governments, organizations, and peoples who have interest in the East Turkistan / Uyghur issue.

The Chinese regime's oppression of East Turkistan's people has slowly begun to make headlines, and the issue is even being scheduled in the international human rights forums. Evidence of China's systematic crimes of genocide carried out against East Turkistan's people, especially against the Uyghurs, is being exposed globally. The Chinese occupation forces and dictators are being openly shamed, and they are losing their credibility nationally and internationally.

At such a moment it is known that some Uyghur / East Turkistan organizations and some independent Uyghur / East Turkistani activists casually met with the members of Taiwan's nationalist party and other so called democratic Chinese organizations and individuals to discuss "how to deal with China and East Turkistan issue after the fall of communist party in China."

Furthermore, there are a group of individuals who were dismissed from the ETGE for violating its Constitution and sowing disunity amongst our government. Despite a successful democratic and fair election at the 8th General Assembly during November 10th – November 12th, 2019, it has come to our notice that some individuals outside the ETGE have been working to undermine the legitimate East Turkistan Government-in-Exile and have discussed our government's and nation's fate with some countries in a damaging way to our national interests. These individuals have unfortunately lied to our people and are seeking to deceive our nation.

We, the democratically elected legitimate East Turkistan Government-in-Exile, have repeatedly stated that the only way to safeguard our nation's existence and their human rights is only by restoring East Turkistan, and regaining its complete independence from foreign occupation. Any discussions, agreements, or contracts made by any government or entity with any individual, organization, or administrative body other than the East Turkistan Government-in-Exile is not binding and these unauthorized actions is betrayal to East Turkistan's national will. Furthermore, we would like to state that Taiwan's Nationalist Party, the Kuomintang, is nothing but a different side of the CCP, even the spy Wang Liqiang confirmed this too. It is foolish to discuss our future with Chinese nationalists in Taiwan, given the fact that the Kuomintang had sought to occupy East Turkistan we had fought a war with them from 1944-1949, prior to the Chinese Communist invasion of East Turkistan.
